Below are some guidelines to help you:-

You may include

A cuddly toy
A toothbrush or toothpaste
A notepad, colouring book, picture books
Pencil, pens
Crayons or felt tips
Hat, scarf, gloves
A small ball or tennis ball
A puzzle e.g. small jigsaw, pocket game, pack of cards
For boys: a toy car, truck, plane
For girls: jewellery e.g. clip-on-earrings,

make up or hair accessories
A greeting card or photo of your child
Sweets

Do not include

Edible items e.g. food, cake, biscuits
War related items e.g. toy knives, guns
Clothing
Glass containers, mirrors
Liquids of any type e.g. toiletries
Shampoo, bubble bath, aerosols
Toys which need batteries
Sharp objects
Medicines
Books with words

If you would care to make up your own gift box with your child, they have been given the leaflets needed. Further leaflets are available in school if required. Your gift box could then be brought to school and we would arrange collection. Boxes for teenage boys are much needed, as few are received for this age group.
